

Volunteer Role Description Community Safety Support Driver

Main purpose of the Role

The South Wales Fire and Rescue Service, Community Safety and Partnerships department delivers various initiatives and projects within the community which require the use of service vehicles. We are looking for suitable volunteers to transport various support vehicles to and from community events. To set up and position the vehicles at the various events and to assist in the delivery of key safety messages alongside our existing teams.

Current vehicles used are as follows:

- Road Safety 'Cruise Car'
- Road Safety 'Crashed' Car
- Firefighter Cadet Appliance
- Mini-bus and Trailer
- Community Safety Utility Van

For this role volunteers **MUST** be over the age of 18

Main Duties and Responsibilities

- To transport fire service vehicles to and from events throughout the SWFRS area
- Refuel vehicles as and when necessary
- Position and set up vehicles as required
- To support the delivery of community safety initiatives and events throughout the SWFRS area
- To adhere to the policies and procedures provided by SWFRS at all times
- To undergo training and achieve the required standards
- To attend volunteer group information, training and review sessions as agreed

- Good written and verbal communication skills
- · Willingness to work as part of a team and abide by specified procedures and processes
- Previous experience of working or volunteering in a public facing role is desirable
- · Ability to speak welsh or additional languages is desirable

Training and Support

- All drivers will be required to undertake a half day or full day acceptance course with SWFRS Driver Training upon commencement (vehicle type dependant)
- A full induction will take place to help you understand what SWFRS do, how we do it and how your role supports the delivery of community safety
- Full awareness training will be provided to enable you to undertake this role effectively
- Where possible, volunteers will work with Community Safety staff initially
- All volunteers will undertake the required necessary checks at the appropriate level for their duties
- · Regular feedback and support will be provided

Varying locations throughout the South Wales Fire and Rescue Service Area which encompasses 10 Unitary Authorities

Hours and Commitment

Hours are flexible and may depend on dates and times of initiatives or events. Suggested minimum of 4 hours per month

Expenses
