<p>I am a journalist with BBC Wales News and I am requesting the following information under the Freedom of Information Act:</p> <p>*Please can you supply me with the number of buildings in the South Wales Fire and Rescue Service area which have failed to meet the necessary standards for fire safety in assessments of cladding carried out following the Grenfell Tower fire tragedy in June 2017?</p> <p>*If possible, we would ask for these to be broken down into numbers of publicly-owned and privately-owned buildings and if possible naming these buildings?</p> <p>I understand the category of building that was required to be assessed includes those of six storeys or more.</p> <p>I would point out that we've received this information from other fire services in Wales.</p> <p>Currently we have 22 buildings within South Wales, which have 'cladding systems which do not meet the limited combustibility requirements of the building regulations guidance'</p> <p>Public Owned 9 Private 13</p> <p>I think that it's commercially sensitive information' these buildings are not named. The residents are aware of the issues and we are working closely with the responsible persons for the buildings, to resolve any issues they have.</p>
