<p><b>1. What is the current number of staff who use a PC or a laptop within your organisation?</b> We have approx.1800 members of staff – of these around 300 are using Windows 10 Laptops/Tablets/Desktop PCs. The rest use Thin Clients connecting to Microsoft Server 2012 R2 RDSH – there are currently around 500 thin clients in use. These numbers aren't fixed as they go up or down as required – this is the current figure.</p> <p><b>2. What are the current Microsoft software licences (server and desktop) that you are using?</b> Windows 10 Pro for PCs/Laptop/Tablets. Around 30 Windows 7 devices due to be upgraded. Windows Server 2012 R2 Data Centre licences with associated CALS (SQL, Exchange 2013, RDS, Server). Office 2013 Pro and Standard</p> <p><b>3. What is your annual IT spend on Microsoft licences?</b> Most licences are perpetual so are bought when required – the last refresh was approximately £375000 with ad-hoc licences bought since then (2015). We also spend around £40k per annum on SQL with Software Assurance (this changes every year depending on usage).</p> <p><b>4. Has your organisation moved, or is planning to move, to the Cloud in the next 12 months?</b> No current cloud presence, no plan for the next 12 months</p> <p><b>5. Are you due to undertake a review of your software estate in the next 12 months?</b> A review will be undertaken in the next 12 months with a view to refreshing the year after</p> <p><b>6. What is the name of the decision maker for IT spend in your organisation?</b> This area is covered by the ICT Infrastructure Manager – the department is currently undergoing a restructure so this may change soon.</p>
