South Wales Fire and Rescue Service has a statutory duty for emergency Fire and Rescue provision across the Unitary Authorities within its geographical area. To fulfil this duty and keep the communities of South Wales Safe, we work together with colleagues from other frontline services and agencies. We employ crews of Wholetime Firefighters at twenty-one Fire Stations within Bridgend, Rhondda Cynon Taf, Vale of Glamorgan, Caerphilly, Merthyr Tydfil, Blaenau Gwent, Torfaen, Newport, and Cardiff. The role of Wholetime Duty System Firefighter incorporates both reactive and proactive elements.

Our Firefighters respond to a variety of incidents including fires, road traffic collisions, chemical spills, animal rescues, flooding, and other natural disasters, they also provide important preventative and educational services to the communities of South Wales. Firefighters communicate with different community groups, particularly vulnerable adults, the elderly, and children. Our preventative work takes us into people's homes to conduct Safe and Well visits and install fire detection devices. We also attend schools and community venues to deliver talks, demonstrations and presentations educating children and the general public on safety.

The Selection process for shortlisted applicants will include Ability Tests, Physical and Practical Assessments and Interviews.

Appointment for this role is conditional upon undertaking an Enhanced with Barred List(s) Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check. Please be aware this check will pick up any spent and unspent convictions or cautions. Prior to any formal offers being made successful applicants will be required to undertake a Drug and Alcohol Testing.

It is Essential that applicants: -

- Are over 17 years and 6 months at the time of application.
- Are eligible to live and work in the UK and have proof of right to work.
- Are qualified in Numeracy and Literacy Skills (GCSE English and Maths or Essential Skills Level 2).
- Have a full UK driving license at time of application.
- Can swim unaided in open water.
